## SUMMER READING PROGRAM DRAWS RECORD PARTICIPATION

The Fallbrook library had a fabulous summer reading program for children this year! We offered 23 programs which included story time with special community guest readers, crafts and a variety of performers. Every craft we offered provided enough supplies to accommodate 100 children and all but two crafts sold out! We had roughly 2775 total children attend our programs, ranging in age from 0 to 5th grade, not to mention all the parents, grandparents, older siblings and aunties & uncles. We registered in house 758 children between 0 and 5th grade and had a 47% completion rate.

Members chose to hold the luncheon at the Fallbrook Branch in June in order to visit our new facility and view all of our wonderful new additions. The Fallbrook Branch has been warmly referred to as the crown jewel in the San Diego County Library System and all attendees left suitably impressed! ## FINE ART AT THE LIBRARY

Art, visual art, is a focus of our library. The permanent installations of art incorporated into the building are quite spectacular and they provide a sense of the possibilities of contemporary art that are rarely seen. The Fine Art Committee is responsible for bringing art to the Community Room on a temporary basis. Recently, we have sought new Committee members and we have had an excellent response. The committee is now composed of Jill Cole, Paul Elder, Drue Sheesley and Larry Miller from FoFL, as well as Ceci Rincon and Ruth Ketchum representing the Library.

Since the new library opened in January we have had four successful shows: Fallbrook Photography, Watercolor, Wildlife and Citrus Label Art. The first three shows were open juried shows and the art was chosen from among many excellent entries. The fourth, featuring beautiful labels from the wooden boxes used in the past to ship citrus from southern California, came from the collection of Ken Rexford.

Starting September first have "Best of Show. Prize Winners from the Fallbrook Art Association Spring Exhibit." Ten of Fallbrook's best artists show several pieces of their recent work. Two examples are shown below. There was a well attended Opening Reception on September 1, which gave FoFL members the opportunity to meet these outstanding artists and view their creations.

## MEET LIBRARIAN PAVLINA NASIM

Pavlina Nasim has been one of our librarians since the official opening in January. Not new to the County system, she has served in several locations, the last being in Vista. Prior to that, Pavlina was a volunteer at the Carlsbad library for about three months and then became a page before she qualified as a real librarian. Real librarian? Well, she has been that for 30 years or more.

Pavlina was born in Bulgaria in the small town of Smolian. For her education beyond high school, she entered the Bulgarian State Librarian College in Sofia and upon graduation and certification began her career as a librarian in her native country. Some years later, she emigrated to the U.S. with husband Bashir and located in Carlsbad. Looking for employment in her field, she had to improve her English, of course, and she set about teaching herself that most difficult language we all know so well. The best learning method is probably total submersion so Pavlina submerged herself and became an employee of a fast food outlet, asking "how may I help you"; "would you like this with that" and so on. Whew! But learn English she did, and she also speaks Russian as well as her native Bulgarian.

When Pavlina is on the job at our new library she is happy to be a resource to her patrons and finds that being a part of the Fallbrook Library staff is "a job of a lifetime". When she isn't enjoying her professional surroundings, she enjoys hiking with husband Bashir and friends or meeting with her fellow Bulgarian/Americans in a book discussion group. Do get acquainted with our newest staff member, Pavlina; she's quite a gal. (She speaks "books," too).



## SAN DIEGO COUNTY LIBRARY NEEDS HELP

"San Diego County Library needs the support of the Friends of the Library more than ever in these tough economic times. After successfully navigating three years of budget reductions SDCL's budget for books is tight. SDCL is asks the Friends of the Library to help with a contribution to the library's collection this year. SDCL has developed a donation and recognition plan.

There are three ways Friends can contribute, support readers of San Diego County and be recognized for their effort.

**1. SDCL's Most Wanted**, a book donation campaign that asks library advocates donating a new copy of one of SDCL's Most Wanted books, as determined by the number of customer requests. On the second Thursday of the month, customers are asked to bring a new copy of one of these books, which will be adorned with a special bookplate and added to the collection to start filling requests. **2. Matching Funds:** SDCL is also offering a matching funds program this year, with all monetary donations being matched dollar for dollar up to \$200,000. Donated funds will be used to purchase new materials.

**3. A Limited Time Match Funds Package Deal:** Friends of the Library can get even more bang for the buck by

giving funds for that will be matched for Hot.Right.Now. High demand browsing collections, choosing books or DVD's with \$1,440 and \$2,700 package pricing being offered. August 26 is the deadline to support this annual package.

**Recognition:** SDCL has developed a plan to recognize donations that includes bookplates, recognition events and online coverage. Recognition events will be planned for donations amounting to \$1,440 and up."
