- 2. A contractor has been selected to install locking cabinets in the Community Room kitchen and window tinting in the main library facing the Reading Garden. Work should commence shortly.
- 3. Four new tables matching those already in the library have arrived.

Opening July 7th, this solo art exhibition will run through August 28th at the Fallbrook Branch of the San Diego County Library. More than thirty large scale paintings in black and white acrylic will most certainly bring back the memorable times of cinema's golden age.

Theo Clifford started as a cartoonist and caricature artist, first for a commercial outlet and later freelancing on his own. He is totally self-taught, honing his natural ability being mentored by more established artists. Clifford studied art theory independently and is an accomplished air brush artist.

When asked why he paints stars from yesteryear in black and white, Clifford says," I'm a classic movie buff. After


getting a great response to my first painting of Judy Garland, I realized I could do an entire series of my favorite actors and actresses from the golden and silent screen era. Using black and white acrylic, I can experiment with tones and contrast, play with light, reflection and refraction. I don't use premixed grays, but mix my own".


