# VISITING FINE ART

At the 2009 Community Read Luncheon, I was asked by Jerri Patchett to write the Art Acquisition Guidelines for the visiting art at the new Library. I agreed. Jerri's guidelines: "Make it fine art: something we will all be proud of." Well, somehow writing those guidelines expanded into getting the whole program off the ground. The visiting art will be shown in the community room and the art viewing hallway and will change every 6-7 weeks. Of course, the Opening Gala (sold out, not open to the public) is January 15<sup>th</sup>. I am writing this on Jan. 2<sup>nd</sup> and we're not sure if we'll be able to get into the

library until Jan. 7<sup>th</sup> (or later).

My art assistant hasn't been fully reviewed & approved by the County yet (so she hasn't started), we're not sure where art will be kept temporarily between shows (my living room?). I think the County didn't put in our adjustable lights. I haven't heard back yet from all the artists for the first show. I have 140 threepiece art hanging cables to put together, and, well, you get the idea !

But, I am sure we'll get it all together for the Opening Gala, and when we do, I'd like to thank the following people:

**The Fine Art Committee:** Mary Perhacs, Executive Director of the Fallbrook Art Center, Karen Langer Baker, President of the Fallbrook Art Association, Cici Rincon, Fallbrook Library Branch Manager; & Ruth Ketchum, SD County Librarian (& her predecessor, Wynne Weiss). Our group, with guidance from Marlo Miller & Jerri Patchett, developed the guidelines & administrative protocol for the visiting fine art program (needed FOFL Board & County approval); came up with the concept of Art Assistant to help with the coordination of the shows & the hanging of the art; pushed for a new FOFL website to enable artists to submit art online so we can archive it for our review; & developed the idea of the Art Selection Committee.

The FOFL Board for approving the Art Assistant position & the new FOFL website; & Shannon Jaeger for accepting our offer to be Website Coordinator.

**<u>Robert Sommers</u>**, owner of Blue Heron Gallery, for helping me interview the top Art Assistant candidates.

The Art Selection Committee: Mary Perhacs; Robert Sommers; Colleen Aichle, gallery owner; Ceci Rincon; & Ruth Ketchum. Our group developed the concepts for the first six or so shows; fine tuned some administrative & website issues (more to go!), & selected the photographs for our first show: "My Fallbrook." Several people in our local art community have helped me get the word out on our Art Assistant position & our first "Call for Artists" including Mary Perhacs, Karen Langer Baker, & Marlene Rantanen, President of the Fallbrook Center for the Arts Group. Our next "Call for Artists" will be a watercolor show & I will be looking for more help, at least until I develop our own database for artists.

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## FALLBROOK'S WRITERS READ

Fallbrook's new county library is opening Jan 22, but the innovative project is already attracting booklovers – and writers. Six award-winning authors will celebrate in the days leading up to the grand opening with a series of presentations called AUTHORS SPEAK ! A FALLBROOK LIBRARY CELEBRATION. The public is invited to the free series, which runs from January 9-14 in the Café des Artistes at Fallbrook Art Center. A collaboration between the FOFL and Fallbrook's Writers Read, AUTHORS SPEAK! Features authors with roots of one sort or another in the local area. They will talk about writing, take questions from the audience, and read from their books, which will be available for purchase and signing.

Kicking off the series, bestselling crime novelist, T. Jefferson Parker will read Sunday, January 9 at 6pm. A Fallbrook resident, Parker has used Fallbrook & San Diego County settings in several of his 18 books, two of which have won the Edgar Award for Best Novel. The newest in his popular Charlie Hood series, THE BORDER LORDS, will be released the week of the author series.

Parker will be followed by Laura McNeal on Monday, Jan. 10, 7pm. McNeal is an award-winning author of young adult fiction and a National Book Award finalist for her most recent novel, Dark Water, a haunting coming-of-age story set in Fallbrook during the 2007 wildfires.

On Tuesday, Jan. 11, 7pm., award-winning journalist & San Diego based author Sue Diez will speak about her book, MINEFIELDS OF THE HEART; A MOTHER'S STORIES OF A SON AT WAR, a collection of tender & sorrowful tales of Diaz' son's two deployments to the Iraq War & their effect on him & his family.

On Wednesday, Jan. 12, 7pm, Debra Ginsberg, novelist & memoirist, & her son Blaze Ginsberg, also a memoirist, will talk about their writing & autism activism. Debra's new novel, THE NEIGHBORS ARE WATCHING, is set in the 2007 wildfires. Blaze will read from his memoir, EPISODES: MY LIFE AS I SEE IT.

Thursday, Jan. 13 is a luncheon sponsored by the Rotary Club of Fallbrook, featuring a presentation by bestselling novelist, Ann Patchett, whose family lives in Fallbrook. Pulitzer Prize & National Bok Critics Circle Award-winning poet Rae Armantrout, a writing professor at University of California, San Diego, will conclude the AUTHORS SPEAK1 series on Friday, Jan. 14, 7pm at the Café des Artistes. She will read from her 2010 winning collection VERSED & her newly released collection MONEY SHOT, which was selected as Publisher Weekly Pick of the Week in December.
