THE DONOR WALL AND POET'S PATIO

The Donor Wall and Poet's Patio continue to be a very viable way for organizations and individuals to support the Fallbrook Library. The Donor Wall, created by artist Betsy Schulz, is located on the front wall between the library entrance and the Poet's Patio. This wonderful space adjacent to the Community Room is equally comfortable when used for quiet contemplation, meetings, or parties. 

REaD. THE NEW ART SHOW IN THE COMMUNITY ROOM

The new art exhibit features fine art prints, several made especially for this show. The dual themes for the art works are the color red and, appropriately for the library, written text. A variety of methods were employed to make these pieces, including intaglio, monoprint, linocut and dry point. Organized by Dixon Fish, the show features twelve artists: Meganne Behle*, Cathi Pedretti Calhoun, Kathryn V. Crabbe, Chick Curtis, Adeola Davies-Aiyeloja, Francis Duesenberg-Hubert, Dixon Fish*, Loretta Kramer*, Catherine MacDonald*, Rita Miller*, Kathy Morgan* and Julianne Ricksecker*. Those artists signified with an asterisk belong to the San Diego and North County Print Makers group.

The exhibit will run from March 9 to April 27, 2012 and is open to the public during library hours. A reception for artists will be held on March 16 from 5-7 pm. Light refreshments will be served and it is open to the public at no charge.

REaD is the eighth exhibit in the new library. It will bring the library to a total of 89 different artists and about 280 works of art that have been shown to date. PROPOSED CHANGES TO FOFL BYLAWS

The Friends of the Fallbrook Library Board of Directors makes a motion to revise the bylaws as follows:

- 1. Article III, Membership, Section 2, <u>Dues</u>: The term "family" be dropped from the Annual classification "Individual/Family," and the classification "Patron" be added.
 - TO: Individual \$15.00 Patron \$25.00+ Business/Organization \$50.00+
- 2. Article IV, BOARD OF DIRECTORS, Section 1B <u>Term of Office</u> be changes from: "The term of office is one year, May 1 to April 30."
 - **TO:** "The term of office for Office-Directors and Director-Membership will be two consecutive fiscal years, each May 1 to April 30. If the office has already been held by an individual for one year, the election will be only for one additional year."
- 3. Article IV, BOARD OF DIRECTORS, Section 2B <u>Qualifications and Elections</u> to be changed from: "A Nominating Committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors at the January Board meeting."
 - **TO:** "A Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the President and approved by the Board of Directors at the January Board meeting."
- 4. Article IV, BOARD OF DIRECTORS, Section 3E <u>Governance and Management</u> to be changed from: "Directors may serve four (4) consecutive one-year terms, with a maximum of two consecutive years in any one position."
 - TO: "Directors may serve six (6) consecutive years, with a maximum of two consecutive years in any one position."
- 5. Article VII MEETINGS, Section IB-3) <u>General Meetings</u> to be changed from: "Election of Directors and Officer-Directors to serve during the coming year"
 - **TO:** ""Election of Directors and Officer-Directors to serve during the coming year for a one- or a two-year term as outlined in Article IV, Section 1."
- 6. Article IX MEMORIALS AND HONORS, Section 1B <u>Memorials</u> to be changed from "The name of the deceased individual *shall* be included in a memorial display at the Fallbrook Library."
 - TO: "The name of the deceased individual may be included in a memorial display at the Fallbrook Library."
- 7. Article X POLICIES **ADD:** Section 3. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY: No organization or person may print, publish, or create a web page or advertisement for either the Friends of the Fallbrook Library or any of its entities without the prior written consent of the Board of Directors. Changes or corrections to the website should be directed through the FOFL Web Manager. The FOFL name and its entities, including, but not limited to, the Bottom Shelf Bookstore, are property and trademarks of Friends of the Fallbrook Library.
