maintaining the planters, led the collaboration between two local nurseries and the Fallbrook Garden Club. Rojas Succulents in Fallbrook and Waterwise Botanicals on Old Highway 395 donated most of the plants. The team from the Fallbrook Garden Club, in addition to Jeanne, included Janice Phoenix, Nancy Woodard and Chris Sangster.

The patios are great places for folks to read and enjoy beautiful plants and fresh air. There are more than 20 different kinds of succulents at the library. These drought-tolerant plants come in many shapes,

sizes and colors and are perfect for the water-conscious consumer or organization.

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends,

Please let me begin by bringing you up to date on the numerous changes in library staffing which have occurred in the past few weeks. First and foremost is that Margo Smart, previously our Branch Manager has been transferred to the Solana Beach branch where she can be closer to her husband who is currently experiencing medical problems. August Diehl has been named interim Branch Manager and is grooming the latest addition to the library staff, Juanita Benedicto (see bio and picture later in this newsletter) to take over her duties as Children's Area Manager. Finally, we will soon begin seeing a new Regional Manager who was the Branch Librarian here when our new library first opened its doors in early 2011, Ceci Rincon. As a result of a major County Library reorganization which is an "ongoing effort to stream line services, improve communications and responsiveness, while bridging some challenging geographic dimensions in San Diego County" a six month Regional pilot was formalized to create two new regions beginning the first of March.

You may have noticed a major change in the display on the large touch screen table computer located in front of the Reading Garden. It now displays the Friends of the Fallbrook Library web page. By converting it to this display we are now able to use it as a "kiosk" which provides visitors with a great deal of information regarding the Friends, the library, the schedule not only of events in the Library but also events in Fallbrook by virtue of its link to the Chamber of Commerce events page. The "kiosk" will soon be relocated as soon as an Internet connection is available to a space just behind the CD rack where it is more accessible to visitors and, at the same time, frees up the space in front of the Reading Garden so the Avocado Couch can be relocated there from the room in the Children's Area.

As mentioned above the "kiosk" provides a link to the Fallbrook Chamber of Commerce events page. That link grew out of a need to better coordinate the library schedule with other events in Fallbrook. As an example, we have now scheduled our annual Community Read to April 25th so that it falls after the Avocado Festival. That will allow us to participate with the Library staff in a joint booth in the Avocado Festival in an effort to call attention to the Community Read, the events taking place on a regular basis at the library while, at the same time, trying to attract new members and sign up old members at a time when we are approaching the end of our fiscal year.



### JUANITA BENEDICTO, NEW CHILDREN'S LIBRARIAN

Public libraries have always been my first love. But when I graduated from library school in 1997 and was offered a job at the University of Oregon Libraries, I accepted the position. As an admirer of the runner Steve Prefontaine, I couldn't resist running the same trails and routes he had. At the UO, I was the Social Sciences Librarian and the Libraries Web Coordinator until 2004.

I then moved across town to the local Community College where I enjoyed taking summers off. A free, three-month time span allowed me the opportunity to spend my summers volunteering in Central Mexico. I worked at a



convent, Buen Pastor, that had served the women and girls of the colonial town, Guanajuato, for over 100 years. The convent--and 6 very hard working nuns, ages 62 and up--ran a shelter for woman and their children as well as a foster home for girls ages 3-18.

In 2008, I resigned from my library position, sold everything I owned on Craigslist, and went to live and volunteer at Buen Pastor. I had fallen in love with the town of Guanajuato and deeply resonated with the work the indefatigable nuns at the convent did. I also hoped to work on my Spanish. Over the next three and a half years, I helped Buen Pastor build a library and a computer lab for the girls. I also worked on a grant which resulted in a solar heated water system that could heat water for 40 showers. I began a "compassionate touch" therapy program that aimed to reconnect the sheltered women to their bodies and help heal trauma.

As 2011 came to a close, I returned to the States to serve as the Community Relations Coordinator at a Buddhist Meditation Retreat Center located in a redwood forest near Santa Cruz. For two years, I lived "off the grid", in a forest surrounded by owls, opossums, mountain lions, bobcats, vultures, hawks, deer and numerous other wildlife. I studied Tibetan Buddhism and lived in quiet contemplation.


I loved working at the retreat center and living in the Redwoods. But after a death in the family, I wanted to be closer to my hometown, San Diego. I began looking for jobs, but this time, I focused on public libraries. I was especially excited by the prospect of joining the San Diego County Library system as I aligned with their philosophy and was impressed by their achievements. After applying for a spectrum of positions, I was offered a job as a librarian at Fallbrook. I am delighted to be here! If I haven't already met you, please say hi next time you see me at the library.
