The 2017 Community Read Event - Saturday, May 6th 2017 6:30 PM

The Friends of the Fallbrook Library are planning some special features for this year's Community Read.

First-off, the annual Community Read will also be a Fundraiser, scheduled in the evening and held at the Fallbrook Library. This will enable the Friends to keep costs down and direct more of



the money raised through ticket sales to the Fallbrook Library. The event will start with a social hour, where guests will be able to enjoy desserts and drinks while mingling with Ann Patchett and enjoying other Community Read related activities. Following the social hour, Ann Patchett will share insight about her latest book, "Commonwealth". The event will conclude with an opportunity to purchase copies of Ann's current and past books, and have them autographed by the Author. First edition and used books will be available, in addition to currently published books, to meet everyone's interests and budget. Money raised at the event will be used to update and enhance library furniture, starting with the reading garden patio.

Ann Patchett is the author of seven novels and three non-fiction books. Her latest novel, "Commonwealth", is a generation-spanning story and her most autobiographical.

Book Discussion - "Commonwealth"



ART IN THE LIBRARY

The Friends of the Fallbrook Library host "CUBA!" and Peter Mitten "Cloud Polyhedrons" featuring paintings, photographs and sculpture from **April 30**th **to June 24**th, A reception honoring the artists will be held on Friday, May 12th from 6 to 8 pm.

On the Reading Patio, Peter Mitten exhibits abstract metal sculptures in Peter Mitten "Cloud Polyhedrons". Peter is a preeminent local sculptor. For over 30 years, he has shown in group and one man shows and his work has become public art in many communities.



In the Community Room, "CUBA!' is brought to the library by six area artists / photographers: Janice Cipriani-Willis, Bob Kaler, Robin Erickson, Pat Dispenziere, Jorge Felix Diaz Gomez and Michael Sykes. Of the group, Jorge Felix Diaz Gomez came to the United Stated from Cuba and Michael Sykes leads travel tours to Cuba from California. Mr. Sykes shares works from his personal art collection collected on his excursions.



Janice Cipriani-Willis, Pat Dispenziere and Robin Erickson explored Cuba and returned rich with ideas that were transformed into beautiful water color paintings. Bob Kaler and Jorge Felix Diaz Gomez, both noted photographers, captured thoughtful and provocative images while in that country. Jorge Felix Diaz Gomez focuses on abstractions and Bob Kaler photographs the vivid color so expressive in Cuba. All have works in private collections, teach classes and have won awards in local and national shows.

With this exhibit, we have a chance to experience Cuba through the eyes of a very creative group. Meet the artists and enjoy food and live music from


