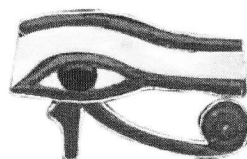
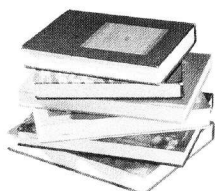


# Insight Bookclub
